Saxonville	Industrial Revolution	If Framingham were not halfway between Boston and Worcester it would not be as heavily trafficked	Saxonville had the power of the Sudbury River and Falls	Different immigrant populations settled the region over time	One mill led to the Saxon Factory Village, which emerged as Saxonville	I, E, S
Learned's Pond	The Railroad Hub of Eastern MA	If the railroad had not come to Framingham, there would not have been a need for residential development	The natural beauty of the pond and its centrality drew a creative and privileged population of inhabitants	From Native American ownership to middle class residential	Superstition, transportation, centrality, and aesthetics lead to an inclusive population	I, M, E, S
Dennison Triangle	Early 20 th Century	If Framingham had not enticed Dennison with incentives, they would not have brought industry and jobs to the region	They were able to relocate from Roxbury due to availability of land and infrastructure in Framingham	The factory closed in the 1990's and the building is now a series of luxury condominiums	The effects of the Depression and World Wars on the marketing of party supplies	P, R, I, M, E, S
